## Getting Ready for the Test (Yikes!)

- 1) Make a cheat sheet. This should be YOURS. Go through your notes and book and make a 1-2 page list of all tags and properties that you've learned with all the possible values you can use in them (perhaps some reminder notes for yourself as well). Making this sheet will take time but will be a fabulous review for you of all you have learned AND will be an amazing resource for you when you start to work. **YOU MAY AND SHOULD USE THIS CHEAT SHEET FOR THE TEST!**
- 2) The test will be a page that I will ask you to copy. This is similar (though simpler) than the final project and does include a couple of properties learned in the last classes (hint, hint). A great way to prepare would be to look at ANY website and see if you can copy all (or some) of it. Ask yourself, "how would I get it to look like that?" You can peek at their code using View Page Source or Inspect, although it's likely made in WordPress (you'll be there soon!) which includes lots of JavaScript and multiple descendant selectors with long-names-and-many-dashes which makes it hard to read.
- 3) Have you read the book? Done the homework? Finished the final project? Made the cheat sheet? You should be all ready!

## Taking the Test (Double Yikes!)

- 1) Download and unzip the test file. Save the unzipped files to a safe place.
- 2) You will notice a file named test.jpg file with a picture of the site you are to create. There is a file called text4test.txt that contains all the text, so you can copy and paste that and not waste your time with typing.
- 3) All images you need have been provided and are ready for you to use. Remember to use alt tags as needed.
- 4) You are only creating one page. Your links may be empty and link to "".

- 5) Your page content should be centered.
- 6) Use fluid widths for the layout—it should look good on all laptop/desktop sizes (1024px-1750px)
- 7) Use “serif” or “sans-serif” as necessary for fonts.
- 8) Main navigation should have a color change of light blue when hovered.
- 9) The sub-navigation (boxes with pictures) should change to semi-opaque white when hovered (as shown in the first box in the image.) This change should transition slowly over 2 seconds.
- 10) Text paragraph and copyright should be stuck to the bottom of the page so that when you scroll up, it doesn’t move.

**NOTE:** Each task on the test is separate and none are dependent on each other. If you can't get one part to work, MOVE ON and get the rest to work. Then come back and work on the challenge. If you are really stuck, you may search online for help by framing a specific question (ex. “CSS how to get text to appear bold”) Using “css” at the beginning of your query will help your results stay appropriate.

**E.C.** Create media queries for mobile devices and change the design (however you want) to look good on small screens.

## Submitting Your Test (Triple Yikes? Nah, you’re done! Yay!)

- 1) Create a folder on the Design Alive Server (A.K.A. FileZilla) called test. (No Capital Letters!)
- 2) Upload all files (including images) to this folder.
- 3) Make sure you can see your page online.
- 4) **Paste your link in Notion**
